How can you check if your iPhone or Android device has the accessibility choices you would like?

Android phones and devices

How can you check which version of Android, your Android phone or device is using?

- Open **SETTINGS**.
- Go to **ABOUT PHONE** or **ABOUT DEVICE**.
- Tap Android Version to see the version your Android is using. Androids with versions 7 and up will have Accessibility choices.

If you do not have Android 7 or higher, you can download more up-to-date versions. The website will explain what to do or you can ask there for some help.

Once you have Android 7.0 or higher, select the **ACCESSIBLE** settings you would like:

- Go to your device's main **SETTINGS** menu.
- Under **SYSTEM**, select **ACCESSIBILITY**.
- Select the options you would like.

iPhones and iPads

On an iPhone or iPad, to check which **ACCESSIBLE** settings you have.

- Go into **SETTINGS**:
- Scroll to **GENERAL**.
- Select **ACCESSIBILITY**. In here, there are a lot of Accessibility choices.
- Choose the ones you would like!
