# 7. Reports from Committee Members DS

Action

• Informed the group that the Federal government has legislation going through with respect to cross-departmental information sharing (DVA, NDIA, Department of Ageing, etc.). This would enable accreditation between organisations to be shared between departments.

#### LR

• BRM project is delayed but still expected to go ahead. Requires some sign-off from the executive prior to launch.

#### GK

- SCIA lodged a submission to the inquiry into the options to improve access to existing and alternate accommodation and submissions has now closed.
- SCIA did a member survey to identify strategic priorities and found a focus on accessible housing for people with disability, people over 65 and the lack of appropriate support funding and the basic access to assistive technology, regardless of which program people might have access to or will be eligible for. In collaboration with UTS they have six (6) students to research the three areas identified

• Raised the issue of grab rail attachments on steel frame buildings, noting the distances between studs. FR raised issues related to electricity running through the steel frames and securing screws through the thin metal stripping out over time. They have had some success with using 16mm paneling on the entire wall that's painted to match
