Home Modification Information Advice

Make the most of your assets. Before embarking on home renovations or modifications, check out the latest in home design, fixtures and fittings. The Independent Living Centre NSW has lots of design ideas for the home.


Did you know...

- pull-out boards provide alternative work heights and reduce loss of storage space under benches
- a retractable hose fitting in the sink spout allows jugs and pans to be filled on the bench top
- a bench mounted boiling water unit or an instant boiling water tap may be easier than filling and lifting a kettle
- fitting side-by-side split drawer dishwashers directly under the bench top avoids the need to reach down to a bottom basket
- shallower sink bowls allow better knee space underneath and minimise reaching in
- a knee space for wheelchair users is required next to the refrigerator door as well as under the sink and beside the cook top
- if you need to sit to work, knee spaces under benches can be covered with doors fitted with storage baskets to maximise space
- drawers rather than cupboards are better for low level storage
- corner shelving can be placed on runners to pull out instead of reaching in
- height adjustable hand basins cater for shared bathroom facilities
- a bidet toilet unit combines a spray wash and warm air dryer
- a thermostatic mixing valve controls all the mixed water to the bathroom while allowing hotter water to the kitchen and laundry
- lever handles and large D handles on doors are easier for everyone to operate
- a parcel shelf outside the front door provides hassle-free door opening
