1. HMinfo Website Action

#### 1.1 HMinfo Website Report

Statistics all point to a positive outcome for each category. We need to use our Google Ad Grant to generate downloads for our Apps by creating a more effective campaign and using high quality keywords.

## 1.2 HMinfo Website Progress

### Google Ad Strategy

A strategy to improve website user acquisition by using our Google Ads Grant was developed and documented. The strategy document provides guidance to research and administration staff in order to ensure that Consumer Factsheets are advertised in Google search results when the target audience conducts a relevant search.

## Website Manual Update

The website manual was in the process of being updated to ensure that content is re-organised by staff role and to include technical information about the website such as third-party integrations and backup storage locations. The update was reprioritised since the recently launched peer review functionality will need to be added to the manual contents and there is a possibility that an imminent upgrade to Drupal 9.

#### 1.3 Website Development

#### Drupal 9 Upgrade

The HMinfo website will be migrated to Drupal 9 in stages over approximately 3 months since it consists of a wide range of connected components. Upgrading to Drupal 9 will ensure that HMinfo remains up-to-date with major Drupal releases and thus remains well supported by Drupal in the long-term. Estimated delivery: July 2021.

# 6. Reports from Committee Members DM

**Action** 

• Elaborated on the risk-based approach for home modifications for more than \$30K projects which resulted in the development of a BRM. Soft launch of this initiative on 30 June 2021. NDIA have consulted MODA and OTA to seek feedback on the design of the BRM model. In the meantime, NDIA will be engaging with relevant stakeholders to inform them through workshops and other events. Comments from the Advisory Committee and relevant stakeholders on the proposed BRM can be submitted either directly to NDIA via email or through MODA or OTA by the middle of April 2021. Interested parties can register with the Commission and online training will be provided to those wanting to undertake the BRM role.

#### GK

- Surveyed SCIA members to focus on three key areas for the next 1-2 years (1) accessible and affordability accommodation (2) Assistive Technology (3) for people above 65 seeking funding packages.
- Partnering with UTS to collect data for research purposes.

#### CR

 Still pursuing for ongoing funding into the next financial year. Assisted 200 people with home modifications since August 2020 who were unsuccessful in securing NDIA funding.
