

From the Editor

Dear Sir/Madam,

Welcome to our quarterly instalment of the HMinfo Newsletter. Please feel free to distribute our newsletter to your friends and colleagues.

As most will be aware, there have been some significant funding changes made by The Australian Government in the Health sector relevant to Home Modifications. For instance on Monday the Assistant Minister for Social Services, Senator the Hon Mitch Fifield announced a further 12-month extension of CHSP funding - to 30 June 2018. (This builds on the December 2014 funding announcement, which stated that funding would go through to 30 June 2017). This ensures three years of funding certainty for the overwhelming majority of CHSP providers who provide ongoing support services for older Australians. It also coincides with the timing of broader reforms recently announced as a part of the 2015 federal budget.

There was a pre-election promise from the NSW Government to bring the National Disability Insurance Scheme nearly a year early to the Blue Mountains and Western Sydney. This advanced rollout announced by NSW Premier Mike Baird will give 2000 children under the age of 18 years of age access to early intervention services in September instead of July 2016 as currently scheduled. The Department of Industry and Science, in conjunction with the Attorney-General's Department, called for submissions on the effectiveness of the <u>Disability (Access to Premises – Buildings) Standards 2010</u> (Premises Standards) in providing access to buildings for people with disability. Closing date for submissions was Monday 15 June 2015. We are interested to see the outcome of this review.

A New Report was released called "A Place to call Home". Over 650 people with disability, their families and carers shared their <u>housing stories</u> detailing the challenges they face with inadequate housing now, and their fears for the future. They also shared their dreams, their hopes and their aspirations for appropriate housing that supports them to live their lives independently and to the full.

Also some more research, a new study by Gustavsson, Bonander, Andersson and Nilson (2015) downloaded from <u>http://injuryprevention.bmj.com/.</u> The Bristish Journal of Medicine shows that while softer floors do not affect balance that the use of impact absorbing flooring significantly reduced injury in the event of a fall by 59%. This is a new and significant finding and while this study was carried out in a nursing facility it has implications for flooring choices in home modifications particularly as they relate to bathroom and living areas of known fallers.

On another note, the HMinfo offices have recently had a make-over with wall sized decals. The images reflect the core aims of enabling built environments. The newly decorated space clearly defines HMinfo's presence on level 4 of the Red Centre and reflects the Faculty's commitment to our research.

The Centre of Universal Design in Ireland has recently invited Catherine Bridge to participate in a workshop on public space in Galway in July 2015.
