f) Occasional Paper: Home Design for Carers (Complete)

Change subtext HMinfo to define what is meant by 'young people' - a description such as 'for carers of people under 65 with a disability' was suggested.

g) Consumer Factsheet: Managing Water in the Bathroom 2nd ed. (Progress update)

The draft documents were included in the AC hard copy and electronic document pack.

AC suggested modifying title to specify wetness/ water spray.

h) Consumer Factsheet: Walk-in Baths (New Protocol and Progress update)

The draft Protocol for HMinfo Publications by External Authors was circulated in meeting.

i) Reprinting Consumer Factsheets, Industry Factsheets, Industry Checklists, Summary Bulletins, etc. (Progress report)

7) Community Engagement

CB provided the following updates on recent and upcoming events and training, and on liaison with industry, consumer, and research stakeholders.

a) NDIA - NDIS

- Met with NDIA OT, Jackie Hiller-Broughton. To date they have focused on Assistive Technology (AT) rather than Home Modifications (HM). Jackie will be turning NDIA's attention to HM.
- HMinfo have written to NDIA to invite them to nominate a representative to the Advisory Committee consistent with more national focus of HMinfo.

b) DSS

- Met with Ben Vincent and key policy makers from CHSP.
- They are particularly interested in issues around HM, including UD and training for building and design professionals.
- Suggested HMinfo look at applying under the Service Improvement and Healthy Ageing Grants fund (due out 19/6/14) and HMinfo are currently designing a proposal.
- CB discussed the reporting requirements of HMinfo.

i. Aged Care Reforms

- Changes to Acts and Principles will move all HCP to CDC.
- AACQA now monitors HACC as well as Aged Care services.
- Only mention in the Home Care Package Guidelines of HM is as part of Support Services: "modifications to the home, such as easy access taps, shower hose or bath rails".
- No environmental assessment tools for MyAgedCare or assessors to use.

ii. Commonwealth Home Support Program

- Discussion paper released.
- HMinfo/EBEP will put in a submission on the paper and its implications for HM as well as write separately to the relevant Director to expand on the issues.
- Awaiting publication of the KPMG Review of Service Group 5.
- The old HACC non-output service type is now called Sector Support and more focussed on workforce training and development, including volunteers.

c) FACS-ADHC

- HMinfo met with Chris Chippendale et al to discuss opportunities going forward.

- CCSP funding extended to 30 June 2016.
