a. HMinfo Website Report

The HMinfo Website Report was included in the Advisory Committee Members' document package. CB outlined the key statistics, including:

Total Page Views to Date: 1,011,013 (Increase of 5,546 from last meeting's total: 1,005,467)

Total Visitors to Date: 296,749 (Increase of 1,788 from last meeting's total: 294,961)

Total Registered Users: 1,694 (Net increase of 485 from last meeting total: 1,209)

Listserv (OT Mailing List) members: 599 (net increase of 1 from 598)

b. HMinfo Website Progress

Following completion of website accessibility upgrades in early 2016, the focus has been:

- Upgrades to improve rankings in Altmetrics
- Continuation of website modifications detailed in the HMinfo Website Action Plan
- Completion of new edition of the HMinfo Website Manual, incorporating all upgrades to website functionality. This Website Manual is a critical part of HMinfo's Protocol Manual, ensuring all current and new team members can use all website functions (even those that are not part of their usual work role) if required.

Starting on the 1st of July 2016, the data collection from Webstats will cease and website statistics reports will be based on data collected from Google Analytics and our own content management system.

In September we will review the HMinfo Website Action Plan and future website needs, to set priorities for the website over the next 12 months. Major inclusions:

 Introduction of deemed-to-satisfy slip resistance
 classifications for class 1 buildings has been met with
 industry concern and need for information. No indication
 that higher slip resistance classifications for new ramps in
 houses would be in NCC 2016 until it was released on 30
 May 2016.

Materials commonly used in outdoor ramps would not meet new requirements and many floor materials have not yet been tested.

Introduction of maximum 1:8 ramp gradient could lead to 1:8 ramps being common in housing, this rise to run ratio is as steep as that used for public threshold ramping and unsuitable for many people with disabilities.

4. Governance & Administration

a. Quality Standards NSW DSS

- Requirement of our ADHC Funding Agreement 2015-2018 Joanne Quinn is that we have a quality management system in place, we need to comply with the NSW Disability Services Standards (NSW DSS), and undertake a Third Party Verification (TPV) of the quality of our service performance against the NSW DSS.
- HMinfo applied, and were approved, for a max. \$5000 NDS subsidy for the cost of Third Party Verification of our quality processes.
- HMinfo obtained two quotes for TPV gap analysis and audit (both > \$5000), and submitted \$5000 invoice to NDS
- Internal review of quality processes against NSW DSS has been undertaken and preparation for TPV gap analysis is now underway

b. Protocol Manual

- Protocol for Feedback & Complaints is a new protocol being developed for NSW DSS (we already have most processes in place but now documenting this in a standalone policy)
- Protocol for Website & Social Media Management being revised in response to our development of new social media strategies
- New Digital Object Identifier (DOI) process and ROS/UNSW works process to be added to publishing protocols. A *digital object identifier* (DOI) is a unique alphanumeric string assigned by a registration agency (the International DOI Foundation) to identify content and provide a persistent link to its location on the Internet. (A Pilot DOI registration scheme was recently launched by UNSW with the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences. HMinfo have been invited to participate in the scheme which will enable us to retrospectively assign DOIs and ongoing add them to all of HMinfo publications.

The Guidelines were developed for LAHC's asset staff to assess Occupational Therapists' reports for NDIS funded home modifications on NSW social housing properties. - The Scoping review on Best Practice for Home Modifications Service Delivery released in March for ILC WA by Curtin University was briefly discussed.
- Teresa Petric overviewed the ADHC NDIS transition plans and process currently underway.
